# Unveiling Bias: Political Polarization in Mass Media

### Abstract

For decades, bias has infiltrated mass media. News articles, which serve as a primary resource for individuals seeking reliable information to shape their own viewpoints, have especially fallen victim to this bias. Unfortunately, this bias is escalating as news outlets tailor their articles to align with their political preferences. Consequently, this creates a chain reaction with dissemination of misinformation among a misled audience. Recognizing the deceptive and harmful nature of biased news, I decided to analyze news sources on various topics to study the difference in the presentation of the articles based on their political ideologies, and the societal impact that unbiased news has on society. The results indicate that political bias is highly present within prominent news outlets, with notable disparities in the way they present different topics based on their political ideologies and beliefs. While research suggests that people need accurate information to form informed opinions about topics, sometimes the inherent biases in news outlets exposes the audience to different perspectives.

#### **Unveiling Bias: Political Polarization in Mass Media**

The two major political parties in the United States—the Democratic and Republican party—have shared polarized views on many issues affecting us domestically and internationally. Recently, the polarization in America has only been growing with no ideological overlap between the two parties, distancing them even further. This has led each party to perceive each other as a threat to one another and to democracy. This deep-rooted polarization is widely present in mass media, specifically political news sources that were once considered reliable for their unbiased stance. The public relies on news sources for accurate and unbiased information. However, recent statistics have shown that this trust is almost non-existent, with only 7% of Americans reporting to have a great deal of trust in political news sources.<sup>1</sup>

Today, rather than presenting current events with an unbiased viewpoint, many news sources cater articles and present information to the public based on their political party views. However, that is not the job of the mass media and it continues to be the reason why their credibility is frequently challenged by the public. Currently, with major events like the 2024 presidential election and the violence between Israel and Hamas, there is bound to be an increase in the dissemination of false information. Liberals, conservatives, and moderates all present the same news in different ways. This creates a chain reaction because with a misinformed audience, there will continue to be a spread of misinformation.

It is crucial to study the bias present among different news sources and why it is that way because not only is it deceiving to those reading or watching the news, but it can also be extremely harmful. Unbiased news is critical for the future of our democracy. The job of mass

media is to simply present facts. Individuals should be allowed to form their own opinion without the political pressure of a specific party. Accurate information allows individuals to make decisions and in order to keep democracy—a core value of the United States of America—alive, I want to delve deeper into this topic.

### **Literature Review**

Media has always had a strong influence on individuals. For years, scholars have scrutinized the media, examining its biases and societal impact. Since the nineteenth century, there has been evidence of bias in mass media, illustrating their inability to effectively convey factual information, thereby casting doubt regarding the media's role and purpose in society. While bias in media is not uncommon, it resurfaced to a greater extent after the COVID-19 pandemic. Studies reveal that between March 2020 and May 2020, there was an increase in polarization, particularly in COVID-19 coverage. News sources known for having far right-leaning stances misinformed readers by downplaying the virus, while left-leaning news outlets described the outbreak as far worse. The difference in the way Republicans and Democrats were presenting the news contributed to heightened polarization and diminished trust in the media. The media is expected to introduce new information without presenting their own viewpoint, but they have continuously failed to do so, casting doubts on the credibility of the news outlet. Concurrently, given the media's significant influence on shaping individuals perspectives, the media also holds a substantial amount of power.<sup>2</sup>

Elejalde, Ferres, and Herder all suggest that media content often presents a predetermined viewpoint, typically one from either side of the political spectrum.<sup>3</sup> Studies also indicate that

almost 90% of Americans see a fair amount of bias present in their news sources.<sup>4</sup> While a good majority acknowledge that there is bias present, only about half believe that there are more than enough news sources to sort out the facts, while the other half believe that it is difficult to sort out the facts.<sup>5</sup> Researchers believe that it is imperative to comprehend and identify bias, hence the need for media literacy. This reflects the idea that "news isn't completely transparent in the stories they choose to report. Having the knowledge that we can't believe everything we read or see on the news will allow us as a society to become a more educated audience." Recognizing the different types of bias may be helpful in detecting bias. First, there is bias by omission. This is the most common type of bias with journalists leaving out the entire side of an argument. Next, bias by story selection is when journalists only write or choose to present stories that support the ideologies and political stance of their news outlet's preferred political party. Label bias is difficult to detect, but researchers believe it is crucial to know because journalists will falsely label people as "experts," giving them the credibility they have not earned.<sup>6</sup> Figure 1 below presents a breakdown of the various types of possible biases present in media.

Everyone can agree that unbiased information is crucial in forming an understanding and opinion of current events. Although news articles are generally considered more reliable and less biased, bias persists. Many scholars emphasize the importance of knowing how to detect bias. There are many ways to do so and this further allows individuals to form their own opinion about topics. This is pertinent to my research because it provides a framework for detecting bias



in news articles. First and foremost, it is important to know the various sources being referenced or mentioned in the articles. For instance, if an article is sourcing Fox News, there is a greater chance that they are more right-leaning and will tend to report news based on the viewpoints of conservatives. Furthermore, the use of certain words or vocabulary can help determine the political preference of a news source and nature of the bias. Many times, negative connotation is used when mentioning the views of an opposing political party or





candidate.<sup>7</sup> Headlines play a significant role in news articles. When an article is first opened, in large and bold letters, the headline is printed. It can be misleading in tone, emotions, details, and more. For example, the following headlines were used to describe the same event: "Judge Allows Testimony of Another Accuser in Cosby Case" and "Bill Cosby Sex Assault Trial: Judge

Allows Only 1 Other Accuser to Testify, Not 13."<sup>8</sup> Scholars also suggest that detecting bias can sometimes be difficult. Cross-referencing your sources with others and reading about the same topics from different news outlets can help validate the information present in one news article. These are a few of the important methods used by scholars to determine and detect bias.

Researchers stress the importance of recognizing bias due to its adverse societal effects. It can affect individuals of various backgrounds and groups and can reinforce negative stereotypes while also leading to an increase in discrimination and prejudice against certain communities.<sup>9</sup> Additionally, research suggests that exposure to bias only leads to greater polarization among groups of people. For instance, Republicans and Democrats have been extremely polarized for decades now and this has only led to an increase in political segregation. Also, individuals begin to be less open-minded and stick to one perspective rather than being open to reading different sources with other points of view. When presented with conflicting points of view and individuals who refuse to remain open-minded, it will also negatively affect collective decision-making among groups.<sup>10</sup>

While bias remains inherent in the media, readers can mitigate its impact by recognizing and acknowledging it, further fostering open-mindedness and informed decision-making. Media literacy is essential in combating the issue of bias effectively.

### Methodology

To conduct and complete this research project, I first read books and academic resources to learn more about the deep-rooted political polarization within the United States of America and the history of bias in mass media, how to detect bias, and more. Furthermore, I gathered data regarding the position each party holds on some key issues I selected. In addition to that, I determined what news outlets are conservative, liberal, or moderate. This was primarily determined through the examination of media bias charts and reading articles from different news outlets. After that, I compared the differences between multiple news sources on different topics and came to a conclusion as to how they respond to current and past issues. This helped me determine the bias present in news outlets. Lastly, I looked into statistics to gauge the societal impact of this phenomenon.

### **Data/Results**


Figure 2 and figure 3 below are mass media charts that were analyzed alongside the articles to determine where different news outlets lie on the political spectrum.

Prior to conducting this research, it was crucial to gather background information regarding the different perspectives on topics of right-leaning and left-leaning parties. The following table presents background information pertaining to the topics included on this poster. Additional information was gathered, but is not included in this table.

# **Topic 1: Gun Control**

Summary: With a rise in mass shootings, there has been a surge in public discourse surrounding the topics of gun control and the Second Amendment. The left and the right have different perspectives on gun control and this is evident in the articles presented by different news outlets. The majority of the articles referenced/used for this study were written after the mass shooting that killed 10 at a grocery store in Boulder, Colorado.

### **Topic 2: Israel Divestment**

Summary: Recently, students nationwide have been participating in protests on their university campuses, urging officials at universities to withdraw investments from Israel. Various news sources offer their take on the issue, with news outlets of differing political leanings offering a different perspective. The majority of the articles referenced/used for this study were recently written amidst the ongoing Hamas-Israel conflict.

Left-leaning news articles delve into the concept of divestment and the objective of student protesters. In other words, left-leaning articles are attempting to inform the audience of what students are trying to accomplish through these protests. While it is difficult to divest, these articles emphasize that major divestments have occurred in the past. Simply stated, they want universities to stand in solidarity with Palestine.	Moderate news sources typically adopt a neutral stance. In this case, they presented factual information and remain nonpartisan. Many moderate articles focused on why students were protesting and what they hoped to achieve/their desired outcomes were. This was similar to left-leaning news articles, but the moderate articles were simply explaining the situation. Previous situations of divestment were not mentioned. 
# **Topic 3: Immigration**

Summary: In the United States, immigration policies have been an issue for years, sparking debates between liberals and conservatives. It is evident through various news sources that liberals and conservatives hold very different views in regards to immigration. The majority of the articles referenced/used for this study were written in regards to immigration policies or are due to the results of immigration policies.

As stated above, liberals tend to support immigrants for many reasons. First and foremost, morally, they believe it is the right thing to do. Additionally, immigrants play a huge role in economic growth because they fill in a lot of essential jobs. They also believe family reunification is extremely important within a community. Due to this, left leaning articles tend to advocate and protect immigrants. To them, sometimes candidates don't matter. If they don't support the policy they are in favor of, they will make it known. For example, the Biden Administration has been supporting stricter immigration policies and VOX explicitly stated that his immigration policies have been similar to those of Trump. Additionally, left leaning articles used biased languages to negatively portray Republican immigration policies. Some words used include: "unrelenting assault," "bullying," etc.	Moderate news articles tend to remain neutral when presenting news. A lot of the time, they remain factual, while presenting both sides of the story. In this case, that was exactly what was done. BBC News presented the viewpoints of both the Democrats and Republicans. While Republicans believe the Biden Administration hasn't done much in terms of immigration policies, Democrats and the United Nation believe they have gone too far. The Washington Post, on the other hand, focused on a lot of statistics in regards to the impact on jobs due to immigration and what might potentially cause the decrease in the number of jobs. Overall, they focused on objectively presenting facts	Conservatives are typically against immigration and advocate for stricter policies. They always portray immigrants as the "bad guy." While numerous studies have shown that immigration does not increase crime, Republicans continue to play the blame game and always emphasize or over exaggerate immigrant crime rates. Not only that, Republicans blame the Democrats for allowing illegal immigrants to enter the United States and stay, claiming they are further endangering citizens. For Republicans, it simply seems like a blame game. However, they refuse to look into the statistics on how many U.S. born citizens conduct crime on a daily basis.

Summary: In the United States, abortion rights have been argued for years. Through the news sources presented below, the stance on both conservative and liberal groups in terms of abortion is

evident. Majority of the articles referenced/used for this study were written as a result of recent changes made to abortion laws.

The majority of the time, Democrats support abortion rights. The following is clearly demonstrated in left-leaning news articles, however that is not always the case. Left-leaning articles tend to play the blame game with the right and portray them as the bad guys, while continuing to advocate for abortion rights, but there are times they remain neutral. USA Today, known for its liberal stance, demonstrated in the article about abortion both President Trump and President Biden's opinion without taking a stance. However, in the Huffpost articles, the author is accusing Trump of spreading lies and myths abortion. They continue to mention that this was done during a Fox News interview, one of the most well-known conservative news outlets.	Once again, moderate news outlets tend to remain neutral. This is demonstrated in both of the articles below. They both stick to presenting factual information with statistics about abortion or initiatives/policies related to abortion. They don't take sides, but rather only present the information.	Republicans tend to oppose abortion and this is repeatedly demonstrated in a lot of right-leaning news articles. Recently, Kamala Harris participated in an 'Abortions Around America Tour' and also became the first vice president to visit an abortion clinic. This is a monumental moment, however the conservative media downplayed it as a "step backward for our country." # Topic 5: LGBTQ+ Rights

Summary: For decades, individuals within the LGBTQ+ community have been fighting for their rights. While they have received support from the majority of liberals, that has not been the case with conservatives. Through the news sources presented below, their stance on LGBTQ+ rights is evident. The majority of the articles referenced/used for this study were written as a result of legislation passing or failing.

Compared to the right wing media, liberals are more supportive of the LGBTQ+ community and their rights. After reading various left-leaning articles on LGBTQ+ rights, I learned that liberals tend to focus more on personal life stories, expanding protection, adding legislature, etc. This was demonstrated in the articles below, however it couldn't have been done without downplaying the Trump administration. For example, in the AXIOS article, the author stated that the Biden administration expanded	In the majority of the moderate articles I read in regards to LGBTQ+ rights, they remained neutral. The author presented numbers, statistics, and only factual information. Furthermore, in the second article, while addressing the issues faced by individuals in the LGBTQ+ community, the author addressed the problems without blaming either side of the political spectrum. If it were a right-leaning or left-leaning article, the chances of that occurring are high. # Topic 6: Healthcare

Summary: For decades, healthcare policies have negatively affected many groups of people, particularly low-income communities. Many liberals are in favor of policies that decrease costs, while conservatives believe individuals should pay for their own healthcare. The articles below are not the best representation of their stance on healthcare, but there is bias present.

After reading various right and left-leaning articles, along with moderate ones, it is evident that the left deeply cares about healthcare policies. Senators went above and beyond to ensure that individuals were not being scammed by health care pricing tools. Moreover, in a lot of left-leaning articles, there are constant mentions of improving healthcare policies. However, there is no mention or arguments in regards to what conservatives believe in terms of healthcare policies. They are only presenting one side of the argument.	In terms of healthcare, I came across a lot of historical context and articles about the improvement of healthcare policies. For example, the two articles below both present factual information about current and previous healthcare policies.	While there was no lie told about the healthcare policies implemented by the Biden Administration that negatively impacted a cancer survivor, the right uses a lot of negative connotations to exaggerate the facts of the story. For instance, "worst" or "the left will not tolerate anyone who dares," etc. are all portraying the liberals as "bad guys." They could have simply presented the story without exaggeration on their end, which would have eliminated the bias.





Bias in mass media has led to significant distrust in news outlets. As demonstrated in Figures 4 and 5, over the past few years, the distrust continues to grow, with over 30% of Americans having little to no trust in mass media, defeating the purpose of news outlets. Bias in mass media can also influence perceptions and beliefs in significant ways. They can reinforce stereotypes, further leading to greater polarization, division, and misunderstandings between groups. Due to the misrepresentation of groups or individuals, there are chances they may face discrimination in the workforce, school settings, and more. Furthermore, biased media coverage can affect the public's understanding of complex issues, interfering with the ability of an individual to make well-informed decisions.

Despite this, bias in the media can open up different perspectives for individuals to explore. Because they are exposed to different points of view, they have the opportunity to make decisions based on those perspectives. However, it is incumbent upon individuals to take proactive measures to seek out news sources of different political preferences to expose themselves to these differing viewpoints.

### Conclusion

Upon the completion of my research project, I came to a conclusion that there is a visible difference amongst liberal, conservative, and moderate news articles. However, this bias is *not always* present in the news articles. For instance, NBC News, known for its left-leaning news stance, in its articles about Israel divestment, focuses on different perspectives of the protest. They address the good and the bad and cover almost every viewpoint. In other words, while news outlets might have a political preference, they sometimes remain neutral when reporting. This is also demonstrated in the left-leaning articles about immigration. They present the views of both sides of the political spectrum without degrading the conservative point of view. This

was not as evident in a lot of right-leaning news articles. On the other hand, moderate news articles remained factual when presenting news.

Furthermore, my research shows that while bias does have a negative impact on society, it can have its merits. After conducting research on the impact bias has on studies, I found that despite widespread distrust in mass media, bias can serve a crucial role by exposing individuals to various viewpoints, fostering diversity in perspectives and ideas.

Upon the completion of my research, I believe that the following recommendations need to be followed to detect and reduce bias in mass media. First and foremost, intensive training intervention programs need to be implemented. There are numerous intensive training intervention programs that aim to address bias that are accessible. These programs are designed to enhance individuals' awareness of bias, which in turns helps foster inclusivity and a reduction in personal biases. This can be useful for both the author and reader in addressing biases. Second, readers need to seek multiple perspectives: Rather than relying solely on one news source, use different sources to read different perspectives that others might have on the topic. This way, rather than forming an opinion after reading a singular biased article, one can form a more well-informed opinion after reading different perspectives on the same issue. Third, look for sources mentioned in the news article: When reading articles, take note of individuals and different news sources that are quoted or mentioned in the articles. This can help determine the reliability and the level of bias in the news article. Lastly, visuals and headlines are highly important. Visuals and headlines are a significant component of articles, given that they are the first few parts encountered by an individual reading an article. Visuals include graphs, charts, pictures, among many other things that represent the article as a whole. Sometimes, visuals and headlines can be misleading and present false information that is otherwise not mentioned in the

article. Visuals can manipulate data and one's perspective. For example, a graph depicting low employment rates for a specific ethnicity or race over two years may not account for other contributing factors affecting unemployment rates that might otherwise be mentioned in the article. Hence, it is crucial to thoroughly read the article and additional sources pertaining to the topic to gain a comprehensive understanding.

Ultimately, while bias may persist in news outlets, there are diverse strategies to address it, and its presence isn't always negative.
